LICENSE & LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Can I drive in New Zealand with an Australian license?

Yes, you can drive in New Zealand with a valid Australian driver's license for up to 12 months as a visitor. Your license must be current, unrestricted, and held for at least 12 months. Both physical and digital driver's licenses are accepted, but you must carry your physical license as backup since digital licenses require live verification.

Do I need an international driving permit in New Zealand?

No, Australian citizens do not need an International Driving Permit (IDP) to drive in New Zealand. Your Australian driver's license is sufficient for tourist driving. However, an IDP can be helpful for identification purposes and may be required by some rental companies as additional documentation.

Are Australian digital driver licenses accepted in Queenstown?

Yes, Australian Digital Driver Licences (DDLs) are now accepted by most rental companies in Queenstown. However, you must also carry your physical license as backup. Screenshots of digital licenses are not acceptable - the license must be verified live through the official app during pickup.

What are the driving age requirements for car rental in Queenstown?

Most rental companies require drivers to be at least 21 years old, with some premium companies requiring 25+. Young driver surcharges typically apply for drivers under 25, ranging from \$15-35 NZD per day. You must hold your Australian license for a minimum of 12 months regardless of age.

How long do I need to hold my Australian license before renting?

You must hold a full, unrestricted Australian driver's license for at least 12 months before renting a car in Queenstown. Provisional or restricted licenses are not accepted. This requirement applies to all drivers listed on the rental agreement.

INSURANCE & COVERAGE

What insurance do I need for car rental in New Zealand?

Basic third-party insurance is included with all rentals, but you'll face a damage excess of \$2,000-5,000 NZD. You can reduce this through:

- Collision Damage Waiver (CDW): Reduces excess to \$200-500 NZD
- Full Cover: Eliminates excess entirely
- Personal travel insurance: May cover rental car excess
- Credit card insurance: Check if your card provides rental car coverage

Does my Australian car insurance cover rental cars in New Zealand?

Generally, no. Australian car insurance policies typically don't cover international rentals. Check with your insurer, but you'll likely need separate coverage. Some comprehensive Australian policies may provide limited overseas coverage, but this is rare and usually insufficient.

Should I buy rental car insurance or use travel insurance?

Travel insurance is often more cost-effective and comprehensive, covering medical expenses, trip cancellation, and rental car excess. However, you'll need to pay the full excess amount upfront and claim reimbursement later. **Rental car insurance** provides immediate coverage with no upfront payment but is typically more expensive.

What is collision damage waiver (CDW) in New Zealand?

CDW reduces your financial liability for vehicle damage from the full value (potentially \$50,000+) to a smaller excess amount (\$200-2,000 NZD). It's not true insurance but rather a waiver of the rental company's right to charge you for damage costs above the excess amount.

Are excess fees different for Australian tourists?

No, excess fees are the same for all customers regardless of nationality. However, Australian tourists may face additional complications with insurance claims if using travel insurance, as claims must be processed through Australian insurers after returning home.

COSTS & PRICING

How much does it cost to rent a car in Queenstown?

Daily rates (NZD):

Economy car: \$45-75 per dayCompact car: \$55-85 per day

Are there hidden fees for Australian tourists renting cars?

• Fuel charges: If not returned with same fuel level

Do rental prices include GST for international visitors?

Yes, all advertised prices include New Zealand's 15% GST. Unlike some countries, there's no GST exemption for international tourists on car rentals. What you see is what you pay (plus any additional services).

Are there additional charges for young Australian drivers?

Yes, drivers under 25 typically face young driver surcharges of \$15-35 NZD per day. Some companies also impose restrictions on vehicle types available to young drivers, limiting them to economy and compact cars only.

PRACTICAL CONCERNS

Which side of the road do they drive on in New Zealand?

New Zealand drives on the **left side** of the road, same as Australia. This makes the transition easy for Australian drivers. However, be aware that give-way rules differ slightly, particularly at intersections and roundabouts.

Are New Zealand roads safe for Australian tourists?

Yes, but with important differences:

- Narrow, winding roads: Especially around Queenstown
- No overtaking lanes: Many single-lane roads with passing bays
- Weather conditions: Snow and ice in winter, heavy rain
- Tourist traffic: Slower drivers and convoys common

What's the speed limit in New Zealand compared to Australia?

New Zealand speed limits:

Are there toll roads between Queenstown and other cities?
